A FAMOUS NATIVE AMERICAN BLAZES A NEW TRAIL

This year the United States Mint introduced the Native American \$1 Coin. Golden in color, it features Sacagawea on the obverse (heads side) and an annually changing reverse that depicts important contributions to our Nation by Indian tribes and individual Native Americans. The reverse of the 2009 Native American \$1 Coin features a Native American woman practicing "Three Sisters Agriculture," the planting of corn, beans and squash in the same mound to enhance the productivity of each plant.



HONORING OUR NATION'S PRESIDENTS

In 2007, the United States began issuing circulating \$1 Coins featuring the images of our Nation's Presidents on the obverse, and the Statue of Liberty on the reverse. In 2009, this unique series continues with the release of \$1 Coins featuring Presidents Harrison, Tyler, Polk and Taylor. The United States Mint will continue to issue four different \$1 Coins each year featuring the Presidents in the order in which they served until at least 2016.

\$1 COIN FACTS

Read the small type.

On the edge of the 2007 and 2008 Presidential \$1 Coins, you'll find the inscriptions "In God We Trust" and "E Pluribus Unum," plus the year and mint mark. Starting this year, "In God We Trust" moved from the edge to the front of Presidential \$1 Coins. Both the Presidential \$1 Coins and the Native American \$1 Coins now have edge lettering citing the year, mint mark and the phrase "E Pluribus Unum" separated by stars.

It's an honor.

Grover Cleveland, the only United States President to serve non-consecutive terms, will be honored with two \$1 Coins. All other Presidents will be honored with a single \$1 Coin.

What's circulating?

Along with Native American \$1 Coins and Presidential \$1 Coins, Sacagawea Golden Dollars and Susan B. Anthony Dollars will continue to circulate. All are valid legal tender of the United States.

Want to use \$1 Coins?

Financial institutions can obtain unmixed quantities of Presidential \$1 Coins during the six-week ordering period for a specific Presidential coin design. After that time, unmixed quantities may still be available. But mixed quantities of \$1 coins are always available - just ask for them at your bank.

Native American \$1 Coins and a variety of Presidential \$1 Coins can also be obtained through the United States Mint's Circulating \$1 Coin Direct Ship Program where \$1 Coins can be ordered without shipping or handling fees.
