Each coin weighs one troy ounce and contains an ounce of .999 fine silver. American Eagle Silver Bullion Coins are rich in history, too. The obverse design is based on A.A. Weinman's "Walking Liberty," introduced on the 1917 silver half-dollar. The reverse pictures an eagle and shield, displaying American strength and pride.
