



# Straight to the Source

**Reference sources** are tools for finding information. Different kinds of reference sources have different kinds of information.



**Dictionary:** book of word definitions, pronunciations, and example sentences



**Atlas:** book of maps and statistics on countries and cities



**Encyclopedia:** set of books with articles on a wide variety of topics
